1. Commencement of meeting and apologies

The meeting commenced at 5.30pm.

4. Matters arising from the minutes of the previous meeting

5. Public questions

Chris Thrum asked that should the Victorian Government or another party purchase the Palace Theatre and rebuild the property, is it possible that the City of Melbourne may consider being involved in creating a Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame.

The Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle advised that if the property was purchased and the new purchaser was looking for a use, then a half of fame may be something that could eventuate.

Cr Leppert advised that the City of Melbourne has a Music Strategy, Creative Victoria has its own strategies and the Music Works Election Promise and Music Victoria has its own strategic plan with each of the plans discussing what to do about industry consensus around the need for a hub and telling Melbourne's music story. Council cannot act alone and needs to take Creative Victoria's lead on this issue.

Michael Butcher, South Yarra Residents Group asked if the Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle had received a gift or donation from any property developer since 1 January 2016.

The Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle advised he has not.

Tony Penna, Southbank Residents Association asked a question in relation to apartment design standards and the Better Apartment Review by the Planning Minister. Mr Penna asked if the City of Melbourne could request the Municipal Association of Victoria to lobby the Planning Minister to make this review a priority.

The Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle advised that the City of Melbourne is happy to continue to advocate.

Cr Ong advised that the current work on C270 – The Central City Built Form Review is currently in public consultation and the Apartment Design Standards is scheduled to be completed by November 2016.

6.4 City Road Master Plan

 - 1.1 Endorses the City Road Master Plan, with a change of words on page 91 to read: The City of Melbourne will continue to work with all relevant stakeholders including City of Port Phillip, PTV, Yarra Trams, VIC Roads and Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre, to ensure a cohesive, connected and safe cycling network.
 - 1.2 Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to make any further minor editorial changes to the City Road Master Plan prior to publication.
 - 1.3 Notes that in 2016-17 detailed design work for a number of master plan actions will be undertaken by City Design, funded by development contributions.
 - 1.4 Notes that Management will further consider the timing, funding and sequencing of the master plan actions beyond 2016-17 as part of the Y4 actions on funding mechanisms, the 10 Year Capital Works Plan and Council's Annual Budget and Service Planning processes.

Nico Kunz, Future Melbourne Jury member asked the Committee what kinds of systems are in place for gaining public feedback from the Indigenous and Torres Strait Islander community.

Cr Oke advised that there is a person who identifies as Indigenous or Torres Strait Islander on the Jury. A lot of work has gone into consulting with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander groups within the City of Melbourne.

The Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle also noted the City of Melbourne is very proud to have the first ratified Reconciliation Action Plan, The Indigenous Heritage Plan and a unit within the City of Melbourne that looks at these matters and takes them very seriously.

Peter Juras, resident of Southbank asked what the City of Melbourne was doing in relation to providing park land to the residents of Southbank.

The Lord Mayor, Robert Doyle advised that the Southbank Boulevard Park will be greater than one hectare and will be a grassed area.
